About Hyderabad

Hyderabad, the fifth largest metropolis of India, is the state capital of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, with a population of almost 10 million. It was ruled by the Qutub Shahis, Mughals and the Nizams which shaped up its history. The city is noted for its monuments which include the masterpiece of Charminar and the Fort of Golconda. Shri Venkateshwara Temple (Birla Mandir) is a Hindu temple built of white marble on 280 feet (85 m) high hillock called the Naubath Pahad located to the south of Hussain Sagar with the Lord Venkateshwara and the consorts Padmavati and Andal Goddesses. There are multitude of Masjids, Temples, Churches and Bazaars (Markets) in the city. Hyderabad and Secunderabad are called as 'Twin cities' as they are closely linked with each other. Asia's largest man-made lake, the Hussain Sagar Lake, separates the twin cities. An 18-metre high monolithic statue of Gautama Buddha towers from a top of a pedestal located in the midst of Hussain Sagar Lake. This statue was chiselled out of a white granite rock, weighting 450 tons by 200 sculptors in two years. The construction took 10 years and was consecrated in 1976. The city is cosmopolitan, and is richly endowed with a variety of cultures.

The City of Hyderabad also known as "City of Pearls" is famous for its minarets and its pearl bazaar. Pearls from all over the world are said to come to Hyderabad and it became the one-stop-destination for pearls. Today the famous markets known as Lall Bazaar and Pather Gatti, near the Charminar, are a favour of tourists and locals alike for jewellery, especially known for exquisite bangles and pearls respectively. Hyderabad cuisines which is inspired by the Mughals cuisine need a special mention with delicacies that are rich in taste and texture with mouth-watering aromas like Biryanis, Kababs etc.
